India-Indonesia cooperation: From shared history towards a shared future

India and Indonesia- the two countries not only share a similar etymology of name, but have also interacted closely in the domain of culture, language, trade, art and architecture. The facets of bilateral relation between the two countries developed from a shared cultural heritage and close trade ties over two thousand years ago. During this shared journey in time, the relations that were supported by philosophy of Pancasila based values of tolerance, non-violence and peace have refined themselves into a more sophisticated domain of political, economic, geopolitical, and defence cooperation.

The first Republic Day of India in 1950 witnessed the presence of the first President of Indonesia, President Sukarno as the Guest of Honour. As India celebrates its 73rd Republic Day on 26th January, 2022, this is an apt occasion to reflect upon the harmonious and close relation between the two countries.

Indonesia assumed the Presidency of G20 summit for the year 2022. The theme 'Recover Together, Recover Stronger' reflects the importance that Indonesia has attached to the cooperation and collaborative efforts needed to overcome the pandemic. As a Troika-member, India strives to co-operate with Indonesia for the successful accomplishment of the 17th G20 Heads of State and Government Summit to be held in Bali in 2022. India will assume the G20 Presidency for the term 2023. Thus, the continued co-operation between the two nations at the bilateral, multilateral, and international level is deeply desired.

The recent time has witnessed all form of bilateral and international cooperation revolving around the COVID-19 pandemic. As this new challenge surfaced, the two nations supported each other more than ever. As part of Government of India's and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of SAGAR (Security And Growth for All in the Region), the Indian Navy launched several missions in the Indian Ocean Region to undertake a variety of operations to provide medical and health related relief.

INS Airavat, an indigenous built Landing Ship Tank of the Indian Navy undertook two missions from India to Indonesia- the first in July 2021 to deliver 100 MT of Liquid Medical Oxygen (LMO) and 300 Oxygen concentrators on behalf of the Government of India and the second in August 2021 wherein 10 ISO Cryogenic Tanks having capacity of 20 MT each for transportation of MO were leased to the Government of Indonesia for augmenting the essential supply chain across the archipelago. Ambassador of India to Indonesia, H.E. Mr. Manoj Kumar Bharti handed over the shipment and also thanked Indonesia for its assistance of 3400 Oxygen cylinders and 200 Oxygen concentrators to India during its crisis phase earlier in the year.

The 3rd edition of Bilateral Naval Exercise 'Samudra Shakti' between Indian and Indonesian Navy took place from 20th September to 22nd September 2021. Indigenously built Indian Naval Ships Shivalik and Kadmat participated along with KRI Bung Tomo, KRI Malahayati and

Maritime Patrol and Reconnaissance Aircraft CN-235 representing the Indonesian Navy.

There has been an increase in the interest among Indonesian students towards education in India. The Government of India offers scholarships under the General Scholarships Scheme (GSS) of Indian Council of Cultural Relations (ICCR). In the academic year 2021 - 2022, 41 ICCR scholarships have been granted.

Indian Technical and Economic Cooperation (ITEC) has done a wonderful job in imparting short term training to government officials from Indonesia. Since 2007, approximately 900 students have visited India under ITEC program. In year 2021-2022, 31 students have done e-ITEC training courses. India offers 100 ITEC scholarships every year to Indonesia along with unlimited seats for e-ITEC courses.

On the bilateral trade front, both sides have set a target of US\$50 billion by 2025 during the visit of Prime Minister of India to Indonesia in May 2018. The vast consumer market, skilled human resources and expertise in the field of Science and Information Technology of India coupled with Indonesia's natural resources, young population and strategic location has potential to provide a platform for enhanced economic engagement. Infrastructure development and energy security are key areas for co-operation for emerging economies like India and Indonesia.

Hailed as the "pharmacy of the world", India supported Indonesia's efforts to fight the pandemic not only at G-to-G level, but also at B-to-B level. Pt. Indo-farma TBK of Indonesia signed an agreement with the Serum Institute of India Private Limited (SII Pvt. Ltd.) for the purchase of 50 Million dosages of COVOVAX

vaccine being manufactured by SII. Indian pharmaceutical companies provided Indonesia with a range of Covid-19 related drugs, including Oseltamivir, Remdesivir, Chloroquine Phosphate, Lopinavir-Ritonavir and HCQ Sulphate.

The two countries have enormous potential to come together to build further convergence in the sector of tourism, digital economy, education sector, artificial intelligence and automation. Both the countries have supported each other at multilateral and international forums to realise the shared vision of regional peace and stability. This has been brought out in a recent book published by the Indian Embassy called "KESAMAAN": India-Indonesia-The Next Step.

Both India and Indonesia have a shared vision and stakes in building a peaceful regional order and co-operate on a number of important security issues, including anti-terrorism, Cyber security and maritime security. As two forward looking nations driven by the aspirations and hopes of the young population, both countries will be benefited by multiplying their efforts to address the broader common challenges and leverage the shared goals to strive for peace, prosperity, and development in the region and beyond.
